

Measure U Helps Fund New SWAT Police Van

On October 15th, the City Council approved the purchase of a new Police SWAT Van, using Measure U funds. The truck is a crucial vehicle for the North County SWAT team. Placentia has participated as a member in the Special Weapons and Tactics unit since the SWAT Team's incorporation in 2001. North County SWAT is comprised of individual agency teams, Crisis Negotiation teams, Tactical dispatchers and other assigned personnel from Brea, California State University, Fullerton, La Habra and La Palma Police Departments. In addition, specially trained paramedics from the Brea/Fullerton Fire Departments are assigned to serve the team as Tactical Paramedics.



The purchase of the new 2020 Ford F550 Crew Cab SWAT truck supplies the necessary equipment while providing specialized support in handling critical field operations such as intense negotiations or special tactical deployment methods. Placentia's team is made up of one Sergeant and five officers who train approximately 200 hours per year. The new SWAT truck will replace a nearly 20 year-old van that had several mechanical problems and was no longer useable for SWAT operations. The all black, fully outfitted SWAT Van by West Coast Lights & Sirens will look similar to the van pictured here.



Southern California Edison Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) for Wildfire Safety

When there are extreme and potentially dangerous weather conditions, Southern California Edison (SCE) may need to call a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) event. During these events, SCE will proactively turn off power in high fire risk areas to reduce the threat of wildfires. To determine a shutoff, SCE assesses the potential impact to affected areas, analyzes historical data, closely monitors weather watch alerts from the National Weather Service (NWS), and places incident responders on alert, if needed. SCE will attempt to notify customers in advance, but erratic or sudden onset of conditions may impact SCE's ability to provide advanced notice.

Placentia Police Department Participates in DEA Drug Take-Back Day

Over the last 6 months, the Placentia Police Department and the DEA (Drug Enforcement Agency) have collaborated on a program to remove unwanted prescription drugs from the streets. With the installation of the Safe Prescription Drug Drop Box at the Placentia Civic Center, the Police Department was able to remove nearly 760lbs of prescription drugs from the community.



DEA Take-Back Day and the Placentia Safe Prescription Drug drop-off program are critical to the safety and security of our community by giving members of our City a location to dispose of unwanted medication that may oftentimes find itself in the hands of children or are disposed of in improper ways. DEA Take-Back Day happens every six months; however, the Placentia Safe Drug Dropbox is available 24/7 at the Placentia Civic Center. 
Fall CERT Course Success

Over the last two weeks, the Police Department hosted the first Placentia-run CERT course with 40 members of the Placentia community. Members of the community, including Mayor Rhonda Shader, learned how to best respond to small and large-scale emergencies caused by a variety of hazards.

The core topics of the course included Disaster Medical, Fire Suppression, Terrorism, Disaster Psychology, and Urban Search and Rescue taught by a multitude of experts in the field of emergency medical and emergency management. The goal of the course was to build community capacity by giving attendees the opportunity to have a hands-on experience with various situations that they may encounter during an emergency.

The residents were given the opportunity to tour the Placentia Emergency Operations Center, engage with the City's soon-to-be emergency medical service provider - Lynch Ambulance, and on graduation day, the members of the course were given the chance to exercise all components of their training during a simulated hazard house.

The Police Department would like to congratulate all 40 members of the community for keeping our City #Ready. The Police Department will be hosting the next four-day Placentia CERT course, January 24th and 25th and February 7th and 8th. 
Placentia Police Participate in Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign




