## Purchase of Support Vehicles for New Fire and Life Safety Department

On June 4<sup>th</sup>, the City Council voted to establish the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department (the "Department") and awarded a contract to Lynch EMS for 9-1-1/Advanced Life Support services. A key component in the implementation of the Department is the purchase of front-line fire apparatus for fire suppression and other emergency response functions as well as support units for various non-emergent, routine tasks. The City's proposal for the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department outlined the recommended fire apparatus to procure as well as two additional vehicles needed to support routine Department operations.



On February 4<sup>th</sup>, the City Council approved the purchase of a Ford F-150 pickup truck for use by Department Staff to transport tools and equipment between stations, vendors and other off-site training locations. City Council also approved the purchase of a Ford Transit 350 15-person passenger van to transport Department personnel to training sessions and other Department functions.

The City of Placentia and Republic Services will host its Annual Compost Giveaway for Placentia residents at Tri-City Park on Saturday, February 8<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. (or until the compost runs out). Residents must bring in their own containers (no bags please) to receive the loose compost. There is a limit of 60 gallons per household, while supplies last. To receive free compost, residents must provide proof of residency (California driver's license or utility bill). ## ADMINISTRATION

### Purchase of Emergency Dispatching Services Software for New Fire and Life Safety Department

On June 4, 2019, the City Council voted to establish the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department (the “Department”) and awarded a contract to Lynch EMS for 9-1-1/Advanced Life Support services. The City Council also provided policy direction to Staff to provide 9-1-1 fire and EMS call intake, call processing and emergency dispatching services through the Placentia Police Department Public Safety Communications Center (“Dispatch Center”).



On February 4, 2020 the City Council approved the purchase of the necessary equipment and software to allow the Dispatch Center to provide fire and EMS dispatch services in addition to the police dispatch services currently provided. The City Council approved Priority Dispatch Corporation’s (“Priority Dispatch”) Pro QA software, a cutting-edge and industry leading software system that guides emergency dispatch personnel through a set of questions to determine the proper disposition of both fire and medical 9-1-1 calls, integrating seamlessly with the existing Computer Aided Dispatch (“CAD”) system, and allowing for better accuracy, shorter response times, and improved patient outcomes. Additionally, the software limits liability exposure and assures measurable standards of care.

### Proclamation Declaring February 2020 as Career and Technical Education Month

On February 4<sup>th</sup>, Mayor Ward Smith and members of the City Council proclaimed the month of February 2020 as Career and Technical Education Month in the City of Placentia. Profound economic and technological changes in our society are rapidly reflected in the structure and nature of work, thereby placing new and additional responsibilities on our educational system. Career and technical education opportunities at North Orange County Regional Occupational Program (ROP), provide the citizens of Placentia with a school-to-careers connection and is the backbone of a strong, well-educated workforce, which fosters productivity in business and industry and contributes to our city’s leadership in the marketplace. North Orange County ROP’s Career and technical education gives high school students in our city experience in practical, meaningful applications of basic skills such as reading, writing and mathematics, thus improving the quality of their education and giving all students leadership opportunities in their fields and in their communities.

### Placentia Residents, Receive a Free Tree Sapling this Spring!

The City has received the Circle 3.0 Grant to provide 100 FREE trees to Placentia Residents to plant on their private properties at no cost! Part of the California Urban Forestry Council's Invest from the Ground Up tree planting program, Circle 3.0 is California's Initiative to Reduce Carbon and Limit Emissions. The City is excited to partner with West Coast Arborists, Inc. (WCA) and the California Urban Forests Council (CaUFC) to bring this wonderful opportunity to our community. Circle 3.0 is a grant project funded through CalFire with the goal to reduce carbon and greenhouse gas emissions by planting urban trees.

These young trees are to be planted on private property, front or back yard, NOT on the parkway and will be owned and maintained by the resident. Trees are 1 to 5 gallon and will be planted by West Coast Arborists, Inc. starting in March of 2020.

To reserve a tree, simply visit [www.arborday.org/circle3.0](http://www.arborday.org/circle3.0), enter resident information and select a tree species. Tree species available on a first come, first serve basis include: Australian willows, Tipu trees, Fern pines, Turkish pines, and pink trumpet trees. Deadline to reserve a tree is February 20, 2020.

The selected tree will be planted on your property (not in City easement). After you have confirmed your species, please attend the upcoming CA Tree Team Workshop scheduled for Saturday, February 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., at the Whitten Community Center to pick up your tree marking flag. Flags will be used to mark the area in your yard where you would like the tree planted.





## PUBLIC WORKS

### Upcoming California Tree Team Workshop

The City, in partnership with the California Urban Forest Council (CalUFC) and West Coast Arborists, Inc. (WCA) have set aside grant funding to plant new trees for Placentia through the Cool Parks grant program funded by CalFire. The goal of this grant program is to reduce carbon and greenhouse gas emissions by planting urban trees in local parks and streetscapes. Funding for Placentia will provide up to 150 new trees to be planted in City parks and public spaces.

As part of this program, the City, in collaboration with local and state partners, is offering a free tree education workshop on Saturday, February 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., at the Whitten Community Center in Placentia. Come learn how to plant a tree, tree benefits, urban forestry and become a leader for our spring tree planting event!

City staff is working separately with WCA to develop an Arbor Day planting event in April 2020 as part of this grant and details regarding this event will be released in the near future.





- Voting begins the month before any election day when every registered voter receives a Voter Information Guide as well as a vote-by-mail ballot
