### COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

The Disneyland Super POD is closed through Sunday, March 7th, and will be reconfigured for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) lanes/in-car vaccinations starting on Monday, March 8th. The site will have less capacity than the County’s other POD sites and is intended to serve people who require an ADA-accessible option.

If you have trouble signing up with Othena, you may call the Orange County Health Care Agency Hotline at (714) 834-2000 for assistance with registration and support. Othena will soon be updated to allow people to see which County POD sites offer a drive-thru option for people with accessibility issues. When scheduling an appointment through Othena, there is a box to check to indicate that ADA access is required, which serves as “self-attestation.”

For individuals with appointments through Othena who choose to be vaccinated at a non-County vaccination site, please cancel your appointment through your profile at [www.Othena.com](http://www.Othena.com) or the Othena smartphone app. For registrants who have received the vaccination elsewhere, you may deactivate your profile on the Othena app or send a deactivation request to Othena at [support@compositeapps.net](mailto:support@compositeapps.net). Othena is pushing out weekly emails where recipients can “click here” to indicate they have received the vaccine elsewhere or they are not interested in receiving the vaccine.

### Electronic Waste Recycling Event to be Held March 6th and 7th

The Placentia Chamber of Commerce will be hosting an electronic waste and recycling event on Saturday, March 6th, and Sunday, March 7th, from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm at the Placentia Town Center, 160 Yorba Linda Boulevard. All proceeds from this event will benefit the PYLUSD.

E-Waste is any consumer electronic equipment that has reached its “end-of-life” or “end-of-usage,” whether in full or non-working condition. It includes most electronics or electric appliances with a cord or circuit board. **There is a service charge for major appliances, including cooling units and microwaves.** Fluorescent light bulbs and household batteries will not be accepted. ### Consumer Alert Issued on Reported COVID-19 Fees Charged to Patients

California Attorney General Xavier Becerra issued an alert warning consumers about some healthcare providers reportedly charging patients a COVID FEE when seeking care. A COVID FEE is an additional charge, purportedly for more frequent cleaning and disinfecting, and greater use of Personal Protective Equipment, also known as “PPE,” during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Those enrolled in Medi-Cal and Denti-Cal are not allowed to be charged a COVID FEE. If you have Medi-Cal or Denti-Cal, alert your doctor's or dentist's office that they may not charge a COVID FEE to Medi-Cal or Denti-Cal patients.

Those enrolled in Medicare may not be charged a COVID FEE. If you are being charged a COVID FEE please call Medicare at 1-800-MEDICARE to report it or ask questions about the fee.

If you have private insurance, you have the right to ask your provider why you are being charged a COVID FEE and what the COVID FEE covers. You also have the right to ask your insurer if your provider can charge you the fee under your insurance plan rules. You should also alert the California Department of Managed Health Care at 1-888-466-2219 or visit their website at <https://www.dmhc.ca.gov/fileacomplaint.aspx>. You can also contact the California Department of Insurance at <https://www.isurance.ca.gov/01-consumers/101-help/> or at 1-800-927-4357.

Patients enrolled in Tricare may not be charged a COVID FEE at in-network providers. It may only be appropriate to charge a COVID FEE to a Tricare member when: (1) the patient does not inform the provider ahead of time that they have Tricare, and (2) the provider sends a written notice about a COVID FEE to the patient before an appointment. ### Placentia Reports Positive Financial News

The City has received positive financial news regarding its annual audit and Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). For the third year in a row, the City of Placentia received a “clean” or unmodified opinion for the audit this year in that there were no findings issued. Due to various actions taken by the City Council over the past several years, including establishing additional internal controls, the City has not received any findings since 2015-16. The City’s independent auditing firm, The Pun group, LLP, affirmed that the financial statements provided were presented fairly in all material aspects. The audit of the City’s financial records was completed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Audit Standards issued by the Government Accountability Office.

The Pun Group audited the City’s 2019-20 CAFR and assigned an unmodified or clean opinion including that the CAFR is free of any material misstatement. The CAFR is a complete record of the City’s financial activities from the past fiscal year. Unlike the City budget which outlines where funds are allocated for the fiscal year, the CAFR details where and how the funds were spent in the previous fiscal year.

“The results of the City’s Fiscal Year 2019-20 audit are a direct reflection of the hard work put forth by our dedicated city staff and Finance Department, and I strongly agree with our auditor’s opinion,” said Finance Director Jessica Brown.

In addition to a clean audit, the City also recently received a two-notch increase in credit rating with a ‘positive outlook’ from Standard & Poor’s (S&P) Global Ratings. The City’s S&P issuer credit rating is a forward-looking opinion about the City’s overall creditworthiness and focuses on the City’s capacity and willingness to meet its financial commitments. The ‘positive outlook’ reflects S&P’s view that the City has continued to make strides in improving its credit quality.

“It wasn’t that many years ago that we had a \$47 fund balance and 17 findings in our audit report, so where we are today as a City is such a blessing to be a part of,” said Mayor Craig Green. “Between this and our positive outlook on our credit rating, I am extremely pleased with the path our City is on and look forward to continuing the collaborative work to take our City even further.”

In recognition of the City’s continued progress in overall financial health and sustainability, the City Council recently increased the General Fund reserve policy to increase the reserve levels from 17% to 25%. Based upon the City’s improved financial position, the City Council has also given direction to staff to continue looking at how the City can improve parks and further invest in City public infrastructure, including our streets and sidewalks.

“The growth in our reserves coupled with the increase in the general fund reserve policy are evidence of the commitment by Staff and the City Council working together to provide good stewardship of taxpayers’ dollars as well as proof that the City continues to be on a strong financial path,” said City Administrator Damien R. Arrula.

### Lynch EMS Safety Tips for Emergency Vehicles

#### *See Flashing Lights, Pull to the Right*

According to the California Department of Motor Vehicles, drivers must yield to emergency vehicles whenever lights and sirens are activated. They must move to the right edge of the road until the emergency vehicle passes. If emergency vehicles approach while you're in an intersection, continue forward and drive to the right as soon as it's safe and stop. It **is** necessary to pull over when heading in the opposite direction of emergency vehicles. This doesn't apply if there's a raised median, unless there's an opening for the emergency vehicle to cross over. Emergency vehicles often use the wrong side of the street to continue on their way.

### “The HomeShare OC Program” Opened for Homeowners and College Students

On October 1, 2020, Homeless Intervention Services of Orange County, a nonprofit organization that focuses on ending homelessness, launched an intergenerational home-sharing program. HomeShare OC connects homeowners (55+) who have one or more additional bedrooms available at their residence with an enrolled college student seeking affordable housing in a shared living arrangement.

The HomeShare OC program provides hope and independence for an ever-expanding population of seniors and college students, two groups experiencing housing insecurity. The first home-sharing program in Orange County, HomeShare OC, addresses the social-emotional needs and lack of affordable housing for both seniors and college students. Since 1989 Homeless Intervention Services of Orange County has amassed extensive experience helping the homeless providing safe, transitional shelter and homeless prevention and diversion programs. We can now leverage this experience to tackle the critical issue of affordable housing for college students while enriching and improving seniors' lives.




