Neighborhood Preservation Program

Neighborhood Preservation Program is providing Placentia residents with home rehabilitation grants. This program gives residents an opportunity to make necessary home repairs at no cost. Residents need to qualify in order to receive services.

Eligible improvements include:

- Roof repair or replacement
- Exterior Siding
- Exterior Painting
- Exterior access improvements and special safety features to aid the physically disabled and the elderly.
- Other exterior repairs needed to correct health and safety hazards.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program

The VITA Program offers free tax help to low to moderate income (generally, \$49,000 and below) people who cannot prepare their own tax returns. C.E.R.T.—

Placentia Community Emergency Response Team Training

The Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.) class is an 8-week course that will teach you how to prepare prior to a disaster, and to know what to do during and immediately after a disaster. The program is free to all participants and you are not required to be a resident of Placentia to enroll. “At Your Service” – Your City Services Online

The City of Placentia is now available to receive service requests 24 hours a day simply by going to the City’s website at www.placentia.org and clicking the link on the homepage entitled “At Your Service.” This new web-based system allows residents to click through menus to request specific services. For example, if you wish to report a pothole or traffic speeding through your neighborhood you can use the “At Your Service” system to submit a request. Once a service request has been entered into the system, it will be forwarded immediately to the appropriate department for follow-up. Residents using the system can create a personal account or remain anonymous. Requests are routed to the appropriate department, containing a priority level to assist in the workflow process. Users with personal accounts can track the progress of their request and receive a notification via email or telephone when their request has been handled. The City is hopeful to use this system to extend government operating hours and increase general information access 24/7.

Neighborhood Services Outreach

The City Administrator and key members of City staff invited Placentia residents to a Neighborhood Conversation on Thursday, February 11 at the Aguirre Community Building, 505 Jefferson Street. The Neighborhood Conversation gave residents the opportunity to discuss issues and events, meet City staff and learn about new City services and programs.

This Neighborhood Conversation was the second in a series of community meetings that will continue to be held quarterly in different areas of the City to inform residents about new and ongoing City services and to provide forums to address questions and issues from the community. ALERT OC – Disaster Information System

The City of Placentia has launched the web-based subscription service AlertOC to provide real-time information to affected communities in emergency situations. A distinct feature of AlertOC is the ability to register more than one contact method to a specific address, thus enabling landlines, cell phones and e-mail addresses to be incorporated into a single notification system. Visitors to www.AlertOC.com may register their contact information and receive time-sensitive communications from the City in the event of a natural disaster or emergency, such as evacuation orders. When there is an event requiring community action, authorized officials record a voice, e-mail or text message that is delivered rapidly to affected individuals. During an emergency incident, AlertOC has the ability to send three million 60-second voice messages, two million e-mails and 360,000 text messages per hour. A citywide test of the AlertOC will be conducted in the near future, so we encourage residents to register before hand to participate in the test and help with ensuring that the test information is disseminated properly.

Items such as televisions, computer monitors, game consoles, stereos, cell phones, microwaves and any item containing circuit boards will be collected. FREE Compost Giveaway

The City of Placentia and Placentia Disposal will hold a FREE Compost Giveaway for residents of Placentia. The special one-day event will be held on Saturday March 13, from 9:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. (or until the compost runs out) at El Dorado High School, 1651 North Valencia Ave. Residents must bring their own containers (no bags please) to receive the loose compost. Each household is entitled to a maximum of 60 gallons of loose compost, which is equivalent to approximately two standard sized trash containers filled half way. Placentia Cable Television Upgrades and Coming Soon to AT&T U-Verse

The Cable Services Division of Neighborhood Services has been working to complete the installation of the new audio visual upgrades in the City Council Chambers provided through Public, Educational, and Government (PEG) Funds. The upgrades include installing new wall mounted robotic cameras, a live broadcast production system, and a cable cast carousel system for automated scheduling and programming of the 24/7/365 live feed on the Placentia Cable Channel 3. All of the updates to the City cable channel equipment will provide a clearer video feed and allow for an easier flow of information to residents about City events, programs, and services. Also the City will be expanding the cable broadcast to all Placentia Residents that have U-Verse in their homes in the very near future on Channel 99.

FREE Used Oil Collection

Don't pollute the environment by dumping used oil illegally. The City offers Free Collection of engine, transmission and gear oil, plastic motor oil bottles, oil filters, and oil rags from the convenience of your home with a simple phone call to (800) 449-7587.

American Recovery and Reinvestment Funds

The City of Placentia was awarded American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds to encourage energy efficiency and conservation. Specifically, the City is using Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants to work with area businesses on energy efficiency improvements, retrofitting City buildings to conserve energy and assist residents with creating a more energy efficient residential setting. The City of Placentia wants to help all of its residents reduce their energy consumption, conserving this resource while reducing your home energy bills. Energy saved is money saved! Conserving energy also reduces our Country's dependence on foreign oil and helps encourage alternative sources of energy.

Conserving energy is made simple with today's available technology. Simply replacing all of your incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescent light bulbs will provide you savings of over 50% for lighting alone. A 75 watt incandescent bulb can be replaced with a 20 watt compact fluorescent bulb for example. Switching your outside lighting is also another great way to save energy and it lessens the need to replace burned out bulbs. CFLs come in all lighting styles to include flood lights and yellow bug lights. CFLs are also available for dimmable fixtures!

The City is also using its American Recovery and Reinvestment Act grant funds to encourage the replacement of higher energy using appliances. The City will be offering rebates to residents purchasing Energy Star appliances – washers, dryers, refrigerators – which will provide up to \$100 in gift certificates for local retailers and restaurants. This rebate not only rewards you for purchasing an efficient Energy Star appliance, it encourages you to "Shop Placentia" and discover all that your local businesses offer. The City's rebate for buying Energy Star appliances can also be combined with rebates from Southern California Edison. Visit the City's website at www.placentia.org and click under "About Placentia" and then "Energy Efficiency and Savings Programs" for more information.

Finally, to assist in encouraging alternative sources of energy, the City Council reduced the cost of installing solar power panels by reducing the permit costs. The City Council reduced the fee by \$574 as encouragement to property owners to invest in solar technology. Keep checking the City's website for further information on solar energy including a forthcoming County of Orange program which will assist property owners finance the installation of solar power units.

Energy Efficiency and Conservation is savings for the future that can begin today. The City of Placentia is your partner in creating a more energy efficient home and providing educational material for all residents. For more information, please go to www.placentia.org.

The City has available a Home Energy and Water Efficiency Survey from Southern California Edison, Golden State Water Company, and The Gas Company to assist you in a home energy audit. Simply print up the survey, fill it out, and drop it off at City Hall. The City will process your survey and submit it to Southern California Edison on your behalf. SCE will send you a customized report identifying opportunities for saving energy and money in your home by increasing your household efficiency. All surveys returned to the City by May 31, 2010 will be entered into a drawing for energy efficient light bulbs to include state of the art LED light bulbs!

Bike Lane Adjustments

The project at Kraemer Boulevard and Bastanchury Road is an intersection capacity enhancement project funded under the Measure M Intersection Improvement Program (IIP). The addition of a second left-turn pocket is required at this intersection to accommodate current and future traffic flow capacities. These improvements are needed to safely manage the 40,000 to 50,000 vehicles approaching and navigating this intersection every day. Traffic studies at this location already rate the intersection below acceptable standards.

Unfortunately, there is not enough width within the public right-of way to make this necessary improvement and keep the existing bike lane as it has been. There are only two physically possible options that would allow the bike path to remain as is. One option would be to remove the center median which divides vehicular traffic and the other would be to purchase or take by eminent domain the private property of several homes along project boundaries. Neither of these options is feasible for the following reasons:

1. Both Bastanchury Road and Kraemer Boulevard are designated as Major Arterial Highways under the Orange County Master Plan of Arterial Highways (MPAH) which requires these streets to be divided highways (positive separation between opposing traffic).
2. Failure of the City to participate in the MPAH program would result in the loss of eligibility for Gas Tax allocations and Measure M construction funding. Without these critical resources, our ability to maintain the local street system would be impossible.
3. It would be cost prohibitive and require the hostile take of private property to acquire enough width in pavement to accommodate the bike path.

On the positive side, we are only losing a short segment of the bike lane approaching the intersection. The sidewalk and bike path will be marked with appropriate signage and striping. The overriding factor for making this determination is the safety of all people using the roadway, whether traveling by foot, vehicle, or bicycle. 

Creative and Performing Art Classes

My Little Zoo

3 – 5 years



City Services Academy

The Neighborhood Services Division is implementing a new City Services Academy to offer residents an opportunity to learn about City operations and services provided by each department. The Academy will educate residents about the fundamentals of how City projects and programs are undertaken, the manner that services are provided, roles of elected and appointed officials, budgetary challenges with providing services, and the responsibilities of city and county government. The goals of providing the Academy are to teach participants firsthand about City operations, allow

participants to become familiar with work performed on their behalf by City employees and officials, and to encourage increased participation in local government.


