They will accept anything with a cord. All computer components (printers, keyboard, mouse, etc.); laptop batteries; stereos; speakers; vacuums; satellite dish/boxes; small appliances; CDs; DVDs; lamps; ceiling fans; Christmas lights; power tools and their batteries; lawnmowers. Light bulbs and household batteries will not be accepted.

Below is the service charge for major appliances, including:

\$10 - Microwaves, Cooling Units (Water Dispensers, Air Conditioners, Personal Refrigerators)

\$20 - Water Heaters, Exercise Equipment (Treadmills, Stationary Bikes, Ellipticals)

\$30 - Washing Machines, Dryers, Dishwashers, Stoves.

\$40 - Refrigerators (Standard 2-3 doors)

We also accept Car and Forklift Batteries. **There is a service charge for Major Appliances, including Cooling Units & Microwaves.**  
We do not accept: Fluorescent Light Bulbs and Household Batteries.

### Placentia Gateway Call for Artists

### Placentia Navigation Center Celebrates Second Anniversary

In partnership with People Assisting The Homeless (PATH), the City of Placentia celebrated the second anniversary of the Placentia Navigation Center's opening on Monday, May 2nd. PATH, in partnership with the City and the North Orange County Service Planning Area, operates the Placentia Navigation Center, which provides 100 beds for individuals experiencing homelessness in North Orange County. Wraparound services such as housing navigation and health resources are available to all residents, with the ultimate goal of helping them find a permanent home. In the second year of the Navigation Center being open, PATH helped 203 people experiencing homelessness and helped 41 people obtain permanent housing. The Placentia Navigation Center is part of a regional plan to address homelessness in North Orange County. This Navigation Center is the product of a collaboration between 13 cities (Placentia, Anaheim, Brea, Buena Park, Cypress, Fullerton, La Habra, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Orange, Villa Park, Stanton, and Yorba Linda). ### Placentia Senior Center

The Community Services Department is working diligently alongside our community partners to ensure seniors have access to food as the COVID-19 pandemic persists. Frozen/shelf stable meals are delivered to each senior registered in the meal program weekly on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Additionally, the Senior Center remains open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm for limited programming. Currently, those in attendance must wear a face mask indoors, regardless of vaccination status. Meal pick-up is also available on site. A new Tiny Tots program will be offered beginning July 2022. The program will focus on introducing youth ages 3-5 years old to numbers, counting, colors, shapes, letters, vocabulary development, and following directions in order to gain valuable socialization skills and prepare for kindergarten. The program will be offered in 6-week sessions and will be held at the Koch Park Community Building, Monday through Thursday from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. Additionally, an option to attend the program just on Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday will also be available. Anaheim Fire & Rescue took us on a tour of some of the high danger canyons in the Anaheim Hills area. We reviewed plans, radio communications, and potential fire tactics and strategies to handle wildfires in this area. The meeting included Firefighters from Los Angeles County Fire, Anaheim Fire, Cal-Fire, Fullerton Fire, Brea Fire, Santa Fe Springs Fire, Corona Fire, Placentia, OCFA, and much more. Fuels that burn like wood or charcoal, or make heat or energy using carbon-based fuels—natural gas, propane, oil, gasoline or diesel engines—can produce a gas called carbon monoxide. Malfunctioning or improperly vented fireplaces, furnaces and portable and stationary generators can produce carbon monoxide.



You can't see the gas. You can't smell it.  
But carbon monoxide can make you  
really sick or kill you.



A carbon monoxide alarm will let you know  
if unsafe levels of this poison gas are in  
your house.



You need an alarm outside bedrooms.
