### Great ShakeOut 2022

This year's International ShakeOut Day is October 20th, when millions worldwide will participate in earthquake drills at work, school, or home! At 10:20 am (local time) on October 20th, the City of Placentia will join millions of people across the world in practicing earthquake safety. The City invites everyone to participate at their own locations.

Many areas of the globe are prone to earthquakes, especially in Southern California. You could be anywhere when an earthquake strikes: at home, work, school, or even on vacation. Are you prepared to survive and recover quickly?

Past experiences in earthquakes may give you a false sense of safety; you didn't do anything, or you ran outside, yet you survived with no injuries. Or perhaps you got under your desk, and others thought you overreacted. However, you likely have never experienced the kind of strong earthquake shaking that is possible in much larger earthquakes; sudden and intense back and forth motions of several feet per second will cause the floor or the ground to jerk sideways out from under you, and every unsecured object around you could topple, fall, or become airborne, potentially causing serious injury. This is why it's essential to learn to protect yourself immediately after the first jolt; don't wait to see if the earthquake shaking will be strong! 
### Free Compost Giveaway

### Military Banner Recognition Program

The Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program is accepting applications for the 2022 installation. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as active-duty or honorably discharged veterans in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, Navy, and Space Force. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia. The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, or destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism, or any act of nature beyond our control, such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application. Applications are currently being accepted through October 21st, allowing time for the banners to be ordered and installed during the month of November. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260, and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department. ### Pedestrian Safety Month

The Placentia Police Department reminds you that this month is pedestrian safety month. The Department would also like to remind everyone to remember to pay extra attention to pedestrians and come to a complete stop at stop signs and traffic signals or when making a turn on red at an intersection. For reference, in 2020, there were 6,516 pedestrians killed in the United States. That is 18 pedestrians a day and 125 pedestrians a week. On average, a pedestrian was killed every 81 minutes and injured every 10 minutes in traffic collisions in 2020. Stay safe, Placentia!

Placentia Fire & Life Safety crews were happy to attend the annual State of the City Address for Placentia. Our Paramedics and Firefighters brought their crews and equipment for this great event. The crews had a great time at the event and were excited to meet the local residents and constituents. Everyone enjoyed the event and hearing about all of the exciting things going on in the City. The Fire & Life Safety crews are proud to be a part of such a great city.



### TOPSoccer

Fire and Life Safety Department crews paid a special visit to the "TOPSoccer" soccer practice the other day. The kids got a chance to meet Firefighters and Paramedics from both fire stations. They received helmets and stickers and got to take a special photo with the crews. Placentia is home to one of the largest TOPSoccer clubs in the State. The Outreach Program for Soccer is a community based recreational program specifically designed to help disabled athletes participate in the world's most popular sport. Our twenty-five-year-old club now registers over 60 players who refuse to let their disabilities stop them from playing a sport that they love. The TOPSoccer organization of Placentia (established in 1991) is coached and supported by volunteers, with the exception of sponsorships by JUSA, Score, and Magic Moments Sports Photography.





## FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY DEPARTMENT

### Lynch EMS Deployments throughout California

On September 11, 2022 Lynch EMS sent an ambulance and two Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to support the battle against the Mosquito Fire in Northern California. Their job is to make sure to keep the public and firefighters safe as the fire is contained. The Mosquito Fire started on Tuesday, September 6th, and has been burning east of Foresthill, California, predominantly on the Tahoe and Eldorado National Forests. Numerous areas and communities were under evacuation orders and warnings. As of October 4th, over 75,000 acres have burned and the fire is 90% contained. Lynch EMS resources have been asked to stay for at least two more weeks.



In addition to the resources sent to the Mosquito Fire, Lynch EMS has been active this year supporting local agencies around the state. Throughout 2022, Lynch EMS and many local ambulance agencies have supported the 911 system in Kern County that has been overly burdened with call volume and staffing shortages sending ambulances, EMTs, and Paramedics to the area. Additionally in February, Lynch EMS sent mutual aid resources to LA County to provide additional resources to the 911 system for approximately ten days.

Many first responders and other support personnel have left their homes and families for multiple days or even weeks to respond to these calls for mutual aid. The service and sacrifice first responders are willing to make is a testament to their hard work and dedication.

### Lynch Paramedics

Lynch paramedics have been working hard and completing rigorous training for paramedic school. There are many steps to take to get into paramedic school. Some schools require you to have taken a number of prerequisite courses including pharmacology, anatomy, and physiology, and microbiology. Most schools require a minimum of six months experience as an emergency medical technician working out in the field. Paramedic school consists of two and a half months of didactic training, one month of hospital clinical rotations, and roughly two months of field internship. Once a student gets through the rigorous didactic and clinical portions, the student (intern) is monitored by two paramedics, one being the primary preceptor. Upon successful completion of the field internship, the intern then has to take the national and state board exam to obtain a paramedic license. Below is a picture of our crews working with a paramedic intern at Fire Station 2. It is great to see our Lynch paramedics work so hard to be the best paramedics out in the field.




