E-Waste Recycle Events

The Placentia Chamber is pleased to announce their upcoming e-Waste Recycling Event on Saturday, March 4th and Sunday, March 5th from 9:00 am—3:00 pm at the Placentia Town Center. All proceeds from the events go to the PYLUSD Grant Program to enhance the budgets of local Placentia/Yorba Linda classrooms.

They will take anything with a screen or a cord. All computer components (printers, keyboard, mouse, etc.), laptop batteries, stereos, speakers, vacuums, satellite dish/boxes, small appliances. CDs, DVDs, lamps, ceiling fans, Christmas lights, power tools and their batteries, lawnmowers, and more. Most things that plug into an outlet will be accepted.

Service charges for major appliances will include: \$10 - Microwaves, Cooling Units (Water Dispensers, Air Conditioners, Personal Refrigerators) \$20 - Water Heaters, Exercise Equipment (Treadmills, Stationary Bikes, Ellipticals) \$30 - Washing Machines, Dryers, Dishwashers, Stoves.

\$40 - Refrigerators (Standard 2-3 doors). Light bulbs and household batteries will not be accepted.

Emergency Program for Asian Citrus Psyllid and Huanglongbing

Between January 6, 2023 and January 27, 2023, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) confirmed the presence of the causative bacterial agent of the citrus disease huanglongbing (HLB) in citrus tree tissue and the insect vector, Asian citrus psyllid (ACP), *Diaphorina citri* Kuwayama. Citrus tree tissues and insect vectors were collected in the cities and communities of Anaheim, Brea, Buena Park, Fullerton, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, La Habra, Orange, Placentia, Santa Ana, Westminster and Yorba Linda in Orange County. HLB is a devastating disease of citrus and is spread by ACP as they feed on host plants. Unless emergency action is taken to remove sources of the HLB inoculum and disrupt the ACP life cycle, there is high potential for sudden future detections of ACP in Orange County and transmission of HLB to other areas. Residents of affected properties shall be invited to a public meeting or contacted directly by CDFA staff. Consultation with the California Department of Pesticide Regulation, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, and the county agricultural commissioner's office will be provided at the public meeting or upon request to address residents' questions and concerns. Residents will be notified in writing at least 48 hours in advance of any treatment. For any questions related to this program, call (800) 491-1899 for assistance.

Local Hazard Mitigation Plan—Community Meeting

The City is in the process of developing a 2023 Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) and is looking for community input. The LHMP is being developed by a Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee (HMPC) comprised of representatives from various City departments, neighboring jurisdictions, key federal, state, and local agency stakeholders, and the public. The LHMP will address hazards of concern to the City, assess the likely impacts of these hazards to the people and assets of the City of Placentia planning area, and establish goals and prioritize projects to reduce the impacts of future disasters on people and property as well as to critical facilities and infrastructure.

Members of the community play a crucial role in this process. Planning committee and public kickoff meetings are scheduled for Thursday, March 9, 2023. Upcoming City Shredding and E-Waste Recycling Event

The City of Placentia invites Placentia residents and businesses to participate in a free community Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event Saturday, April 15th from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm at Placentia Civic Center (401 East Chapman Avenue). Paper Depot will be present at the event to destroy confidential documents on-site. Limit four (4) banker box-size containers from each household or business located in Placentia. Residents are asked to please place items in the trunk for easy access, and if material is in a 3-ring binder, please remove before shredding. Attan Recycling will be present to collect e-waste. SB 1383 Mandatory Compliance is Coming to Placentia!

Beginning Summer of 2023, Placentia residents will be able to divert food scraps from the trash bin to reduce the amount of organic waste sent to local landfills. Single-family residences will commingle food scraps with yard waste in the brown bin. Multi-family residences will obtain designated receptacles for organics and recyclables. As of now, there is no change to current waste disposal for residents, with the exception of residents in the Hamer Island neighborhood, whose organics recycling program went into effect in July 2022. Hamer Island residents can already dispose of food scraps in the brown bin. Organics recycling service is currently available to businesses. To enroll, contact Republic Services at (714) 238-3300. City Hosts Local Officials at Placentia Navigation Center

In partnership with People Assisting The Homeless (PATH), the City of Placentia hosted the North Orange County Service Planning Area (North SPA) City Council Members and other local officials at the Placentia Navigation Center on Wednesday, February 22nd. The Placentia Navigation Center is part of a regional plan to address homelessness in North Orange County. This Navigation Center is the product of a collaboration between 13 cities (Placentia, Anaheim, Brea, Buena Park, Cypress, Fullerton, La Habra, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Orange, Villa Park, Stanton, and Yorba Linda).



The City wanted to provide newly elected North SPA City Council Members with the opportunity to tour the facility and meet and interact with the residents who are currently being served by the Placentia Navigation Center. PATH, in partnership with the City and the North SPA, operates the Placentia Navigation Center, which provides 100 beds for individuals experiencing homelessness in North Orange County. Wraparound services such as housing navigation and health resources are available to all residents, with the ultimate goal of helping them find a permanent home. The Navigation Center works to not only house the homeless but to provide health resources, counseling, job and social skills, and opportunities to reunite with family and friends, with the goal of integrating North Orange County's homeless to become productive members of society while decreasing the homeless population in public areas. Proposed Senior/Community Center Project

The City of Placentia and the Blue Ribbon Committee have embarked on a project to design a proposed new Senior/Community Center at Tri-City Park. The City Council formed the Blue-Ribbon Committee to assist the City in identifying the need and recommend design components of a proposed Senior/Community Center facility. The proposed facility will provide seniors and residents with a much-needed space to serve the growing needs of our senior population and residents by offering robust programs and services for all ages. The current Placentia Senior Center is located in the 100-year-old Edwin T. Powell building at 143 S. Bradford Avenue. Current programs include Bingo, knitting and crocheting clubs, exercise classes, movies, and social opportunities, all of which are limited by the size of this historic 4,500-square-foot building. The newly proposed Senior/Community Center is envisioned as a true civic destination in being vibrant, active, and rich with diverse resources, services, technologies, programs, and events, thereby addressing the needs of Placentia's growing senior population. On Wednesday, February 15th, the Blue Ribbon Committee held a joint meeting with the Parks, Arts, and Recreation Commission, and the Senior Advisory Committee to review and discuss the project. The Commissioners and Committee members participated in a Needs Assessment exercise during the meeting.

The City and the Blue Ribbon Committee is now conducting the Needs Assessment Survey for the proposed Senior/Community Center and would like your input on your priorities for community activities and spaces for the new facility, as well as on design values and key features. 


