Local Hazard Mitigation Plan—Public Outreach Survey

Help the City develop the 2023 Local Hazard Mitigation Plan! Floods, earthquakes, fires, and severe weather are just a few of the hazards of concern to our City. While natural hazards such as these cannot be prevented, a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) forms the foundation for a community's long-term strategy to reduce disaster losses by breaking the repeated cycle of disaster damage and reconstruction. Communities with a FEMA-approved LHMP are eligible to apply for both pre- and post-disaster mitigation grant funding and are better positioned to respond and recover when disasters occur.

The City of Placentia is conducting a public outreach survey to better understand our community as it pertains to hazards. We want to know which hazards our community is concerned about and the level of preparedness within our community. E-Waste Recycling Event

The Placentia Chamber is pleased to announce their upcoming e-Waste Recycling Event on Saturday, May 13th and Sunday, May 14th from 9:00 am—3:00 pm at the Placentia Town Center. All proceeds from the events go to the PYLUSD Grant Program to enhance the budgets of local Placentia/Yorba Linda classrooms. They will take anything with a screen or a cord. All computer components (printers, keyboard, mouse, etc.), laptop batteries, stereos, speakers, vacuums, satellite dish/boxes, small appliances. CDs, DVDs, lamps, ceiling fans, Christmas lights, power tools and their batteries, lawnmowers, and more. Most things that plug into an outlet will be accepted.

Service charges for major appliances will include: \$10 - Microwaves, Cooling Units (Water Dispensers, Air Conditioners, Personal Refrigerators) \$20 - Water Heaters, Exercise Equipment (Treadmills, Stationary Bikes, Ellipticals) \$30 - Washing Machines, Dryers, Dishwashers, Stoves. \$40 - Refrigerators (Standard 2-3 doors). Light bulbs and household batteries will not be accepted.

Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP)/Huanglongbing (HLB) Proclamation of Emergency Program

Between February 28th and March 30th, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) confirmed the presence of the causative bacterial agent of the citrus disease huanglongbing (HLB) in citrus tree tissue and the insect vector Asian citrus psyllid (ACP), *Diaphorina citri* Kuwayama. Citrus tree tissues and insect vectors were collected in the cities and communities of Anaheim, Costa Mesa, Fountain Valley, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, Midway City, Orange, Placentia, Santa Ana, Tustin, and Westminster in Orange County. HLB is a devastating disease of citrus and is spread through feeding action by populations of ACP. HLB/ACP present a significant threat to California's commercial citrus production, residential citrus plantings, natural resources, and economy. Unless emergency action is taken to disrupt the ACP life cycles, there is potential for sudden future detections in Orange County. Residents of affected properties will be invited to a public meeting or contacted directly by CDFA staff. Consultation with the California Department of Pesticide Regulation, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, and the county agricultural commissioner's office will be provided at the public meeting. Residents are notified in writing at least 48 hours in advance of any treatment. For any questions related to this program, contact CDFA at (800) 491-1899 for assistance.

Proposed Senior/Community Center Project Information and Upcoming Community Meetings

The City of Placentia and the Blue Ribbon Committee have embarked on a project to design a proposed new Senior/Community Center at Tri-City Park. The City Council formed the Blue-Ribbon Committee to assist the City in identifying the need and recommend design components of a proposed Senior/Community Center facility. The proposed facility will provide seniors and residents with a much-needed space to serve the needs of our residents and rapidly growing senior population by offering robust programs and services for all ages. The current Placentia Senior Center is located in the 100-year-old Edwin T. Powell building at 143 S. Bradford Avenue. Current programs include Bingo, knitting and crocheting clubs, exercise classes, movies, and social opportunities, all of which are limited by the size of this historic 4,500-square-foot building. The newly proposed Senior/Community Center is envisioned as a true civic destination in being vibrant, active, and rich with diverse resources, services, technologies, programs, and events, thereby addressing the needs of Placentia's growing senior population. Recently, the Blue Ribbon Committee held a joint meeting with the Parks, Arts, and Recreation Commission, and the Senior Advisory Committee to review and discuss the project. The Commissioners and Committee members participated in a Needs Assessment exercise during the meeting.

The City and the Blue Ribbon Committee are now conducting the Needs Assessment Survey for the proposed Senior/Community Center. We would like your input on your priorities for community activities and spaces for the new facility, as well as on design values and key features. 

Main Street Parking Lot in Old Town Reopens after Major Renovation

The City is pleased to announce that the rehabilitation of the Main Street Parking Lot in Old Town has been completed, and the lot will open to the public on Friday morning. This parking lot is at 321 S. Main Street, just south of Santa Fe Avenue. The City Council allocated funds in this year’s capital improvement program budget to repave and restripe an existing dirt lot and install new parking lot lights, landscaping, fencing, and new ADA parking stalls and path of travel. The new lighting makes it much safer to use the lot at night, and the new landscape improvements will also provide additional aesthetic benefits. In addition, a new lighted parking identification sign developed as part of the Old Town Placentia Wayfinding Signage Program will be installed in approximately 6-8 weeks. The newly renovated parking lot provides 65 much-needed parking spaces in the heart of Old Town. Parking restrictions will be enforced as no overnight parking between 2:00 am and 6:00 am is allowed, and 4-hour time limits will be enforced throughout the balance of the day.

In addition to the improvements in the Main Street Parking Lot, new parking lot lights were added in the Crowther Parking Lot, located on the opposite side of the train tracks and immediately adjacent to the Bradford Pedestrian Bridge. The new lighting in this parking lot and new lighting and monitored security cameras recently installed on the bridge will make it much safer to park here at night to access Old Town after dark. There are no time limits enforced in the Crowther Parking lot other than a no overnight parking restriction from 2:00 am to 6:00 am.

The next time you visit Old Town, keep an eye out for our new lot and try it out!

Chapman Corridor Revitalization Plan



The City is embarking on an effort to revitalize Chapman Avenue, between the 57 freeway and Kraemer Boulevard, with enhanced land uses, development standards, and design guidelines tailored to their immediate neighborhood. Coined the “Chapman Corridor,” this stretch of the thoroughfare is envisioned to allow for integrated land use patterns that encourage multimodal travel, walkability, mixed-use development, medium- to high-density residential, public/private open space opportunities, and high-quality urban design that is in scale with both a respective property and its surrounding area. The goal is to encourage a network of cohesive developments that revitalizes the corridor, provides a path to the Old Town and Packing House Districts, and anchor the westerly city boundary with the City’s Civic Center to the east.

On October 1, 2019, City Council adopted the comprehensive General Plan Update. This update included all Elements of the General Plan except the Housing Element, which will come before the City Council as an amended document. The adopted Land Use Element of the 2019 General Plan strongly encourages enhancements and improvements to the visual image, physical design characteristics, economic vitality, and infrastructure of the Chapman Corridor. The current effort to develop the Chapman Corridor Revitalization Plan aims to bring this vision to fruition.

The City has and will be coordinating a variety of outreach efforts that will be disseminated to the public at large, including property owners, business owners, and stakeholders. These outreach efforts will be provided via fliers, social media postings, and on the City's website at www.placentia.org/chapmancorridor, as a means of engaging the community and keep the public up-to-date with the latest developments of the plan. One such effort is through an online survey that is intended to allow the public to provide feedback on the proposed plan. 


