Wireless Facilities in the City

In response to ever increasing consumer demand for wireless technology, to include increased use of cell phones and heavier reliance on smart phones with data and video capability, wireless carriers are proposing to build more wireless facilities (cell towers). In Placentia, where almost 70% of our land use is residential, City leaders desire to maintain the high quality residential character that makes Placentia such a pleasant place to live.

When siting a new location, wireless carriers respond to consumer complaints about coverage as well as conduct a review of present and future demand. An additional need is to ensure adequate 911 emergency capability as required by the federal government. The City will work with a carrier to identify a site that meets these needs as well as one that does not degrade our residential quality of life. Sites in commercial or manufacturing zones are strongly encouraged; however, sites within the residential areas are also required to provide adequate coverage.

The City allows wireless sites on public property within the residential zones. Proposed sites are reviewed by staff and, if proposed at a park site, the Recreation and Parks Commission prior to a noticed public hearing before the Planning Commission. In order to reduce the amount of wireless sites, the City encourages co-locating carriers on one site. Additionally, the sites must meet high aesthetic standards in order to better blend antennas into the natural environment. A great example of this is the current wireless tower at Tuffree Park which was designed to resemble a pine tree.

Resident concerns about radio frequency (RF) emissions have been expressed during meetings. RF emissions are essentially radio waves. RF emissions come from all parts of the electromagnetic spectrum and are used to transmit all forms of communication wirelessly: AM and FM radio, television broadcasts, baby monitors, cordless phones, blue tooth sets and, of course, cell phones. The Federal Communications Commission regulates RF emissions and through the Telecom Act of 1996, prohibits local governments from regulating the placement of wireless facilities based on RF emissions as long as those facilities comply with FCC guidelines. Accordingly, when reviewing a wireless facility, the City's Planning Commission may only determine whether a wireless facility demonstrates planned compliance with FCC regulations. City code requires that a wireless facility be at least 100 feet away from a residential structure. When possible, more distance is planned by staff. Staff requires wireless carriers to stealth, or blend, the proposed facility into the surrounding in which it is proposed, for example: a pine tree or palm tree. Kraemer Memorial Park Improvements

Over the last several months the City has worked on a project to make improvements and upgrades to Kraemer Memorial Park located at 201 N. Bradford Avenue at the corner of Bradford and Chapman Avenues. The project has greatly improved the park adding a brand new restroom facility, basketball court, volleyball court, and additional lighting both in the renovated park area and around the Backs Community Building at the east end of the park. The goal of the project was to enhance safety, accessibility and create additional recreational opportunities for the public to enjoy. The project was funded entirely through State and Federal Grants and developers fees received specifically for park development throughout the City.

ALERT OC – Disaster Information System

The City of Placentia has launched the web-based subscription service AlertOC to provide realtime information to affected communities in emergency situations. A distinct feature of AlertOC is the ability to register more than one contact method to a specific address, thus enabling landlines, cell phones and e-mail addresses to be incorporated into a single notification system. Visitors to www.AlertOC.com may register their contact information and receive time-sensitive communications from the City in the event of a natural disaster or emergency, such as evacuation orders. When there is an event requiring community action, authorized officials record a voice, e-mail or text message that is delivered rapidly to affected individuals. During an emergency incident, AlertOC has the ability to send three million 60-second voice messages, two million e-mails and 360,000 text messages per hour. A citywide test of the AlertOC will be conducted in the near future, so we encourage residents to register before hand to participate in the test and help with ensuring that the test information is disseminated properly.

Items such as televisions, computer monitors, game consoles, stereos, cell phones, microwaves and any item containing circuit boards will be collected. Public Works: Improving Placentia

Even with the difficult economy and reduced City revenues, making public infrastructure improvements within the City are a priority for the City Council. The City's Public Works Department was very busy in 2011 and completed several long-needed projects. Public improvement projects are typically grant funded, and the City continues to be aggressive in pursuing such funds.

During 2011, completed projects include: the Lyons Way sewer rehabilitation; Van Buren Street Improvement Project; 2011 Residential Slurry Seal; Bradford/Madison Safe Route to Schools Intersection Project; and, the City Hall Bus Pad reconstruction. The Bradford/Madison project culminated over ten years of progress in order to install a signalized intersection, complete property acquisitions and install sidewalks in order to create a safer pedestrian environment adjacent to Valencia High School. The City Hall Bus Pad project installed a thick concrete pad in the street to handle the extreme weight of OCTA busses stopping to pick up/drop off passengers. The new concrete bus pad prevents buckling of the street asphalt and reduces damage to the curb and gutter area, providing a safer transition for pedestrians and disabled bus riders.

Also completed during 2011 was a critical study called the Pavement Management Program. This study analyzed the condition of the City's residential and arterial streets and assigned a score on a 1 to 100 scale. With this information, the City will design the 2012 Street Improvement Project which will use proceeds from a recent Gas Tax Bond in order to make approximately \$2.5 million in critical street improvements – the majority of them within our residential neighborhoods. Paint Your Heart Out Program

In 19 years, Paint Your Heart Out volunteer teams have repaired & painted over 900 homes for senior, low income or disabled homeowners in the cities of Anaheim, Brea, Orange, Santa Ana and now PLACENTIA. Services are provided in partnership with the City of Placentia Neighborhood Services, all at no cost to the homeowner.



Our services include prep, paint, yard clean-up, weatherizing, energy audits, tree trimming, tree planting and dusk to dawn lighting just to list a few. The work is done by volunteers who generously donate their time and hard work for those deserving neighbors in the communities we serve. 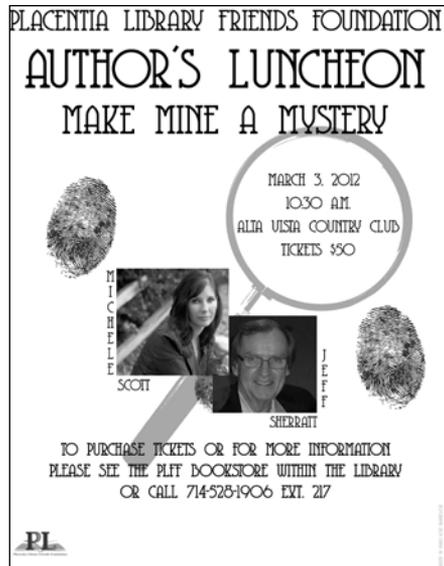
