CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Smith called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.

City Attorney/Authority Counsel Bettenhausen stated that there were two (2) items on the Closed Session agenda, the City Council discussed each of those items, and direction was provided. He noted that there was nothing further to report.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:

City Administrator Arrula welcomed and introduced four (4) new City of Placentia employees.

Deputy Fire Chief Api Weinert. Chief Weinert previously served as division chief overseeing logistics for the Laguna Beach Fire Department and worked for the Department since 1988. He has led the operations EMS training and arson divisions and has responded to many significant events throughout his career including the L.A. riots, the Laguna fire of 1993 and as a strike team engine leader to multiple wildland fires across California. He also served 23 years as a professional ocean lifeguard and eight years as a paid professional ski patrolman.

Public Safety Communications Dispatcher Serene Bueno. Serene previously worked at the Orange County Probation Department as an office assistant. Serena enjoys working for the communication center and always tries to bring a positive and joyful disposition to her work.

Public Safety Communications Dispatcher Yaresly Santana previously worked at the Orange County District Attorney's office as an information processing technician. She is a fluent Spanish speaker and assists her teammates in the communication center with translating calls for service.

Public Safety Communications Dispatcher Angelica (Angie) Ramos. Angie previously worked for the Transportation Security Administration at LAX as a transportation security officer and passenger support specialist. Since joining the team Angie has participated in several of the Communication Center's community events, including the Citizens Academy, Danish with a Dispatcher and the First Responders Breakfast.

City Clerk McKinnell stated that the City Clerk's Office had received no public comment and there were no members of the public wishing to speak.

Mayor Smith thanked Ms. Acosta-Reyes for the excellent report.

City Administrator Arrula expressed appreciation to Public Safety Communications Manager Stefanie Acosta-Reyes and Deputy City Administrator Rosanna Ramirez for their hard work and efforts.

Mayor Smith echoed Mr. Arrula's comments and expressed appreciation for the special events and outreach to the public and the excellent service provided by the City's first responders.

CITY COUNCIL/BOARD MEMBERS REQUESTS:

Mayor Pro Tem Yamaguchi requested that an item to discuss funding options for the proposed senior center be agendized.

City Administrator Arrula stated that the item is scheduled for September when the 35% design and engineer's cost estimate will be available. He noted that the Council will also be deciding on whether to award the 65% design to complete the project to 100% construction.

Mayor Pro Tem Yamaguchi requested that the item be agendized earlier than September so that the Council can discuss the item.
