City Cooling Center

With another weekend of high temperatures expected, the City will open a cooling center at the Whitten Community Center, 900 S. Melrose St. The days/hours of operation will be Saturday, Sunday, and Monday from 2:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. Tips on staying cool during extreme heat events include staying hydrated, staying in cool air-conditioned locations, wearing light loose-fitting clothing, and limiting outdoor activities during peak afternoon hours. Recognize the signs of heat illnesses, such as heavy sweating, weakness, dizziness, nausea, and headaches. If you suspect you or someone else may be experiencing heat illness, move to a cooler place, use cool cloths, and drink water. In cases of heat stroke or severe symptoms, call 9-1-1 immediately. Protect Your Pipes this Halloween Season

Don't be tricked this Halloween! Disposable wipes – like baby wipes, cleaning wipes, or cosmetic wipes – can cause clogs in your home and wreak havoc in OC San's collection and treatment system. Unlike toilet paper, wipes don't break down in water and, instead, remain intact as they move throughout the sewer system. This can lead to damaging clogs in your home, or bigger issues for OC San's regional sewer line and treatment plant.

Not only can flushing wipes lead to a costly mess, but it can also pose health risks should an overflow happen inside your home. If a wipe happens to make it through your sewer lateral, it can lead to bigger problems in the local or regional sewer system. Wipes in the sewer system can mix with fats, oil, and grease (which also don't belong down the drain), to create rock-like masses that lead to clogs and cost millions of dollars to fix. This also has the potential to lead to overflows in the street, harming the environment by polluting local waterways and putting public health at risk.

Voter Registration Deadline is October 21st

The voter registration deadline for the 2024 Presidential General Election is October 21st. You can register to vote in Orange County online today at www.ocvote.gov/register. If you want to check your registration status, or if you need to make updates, you can do so online at www.ocvote.gov/verify. If you are unable to meet the voter registration deadline, you can still conditionally register to vote through November 5th. Conditional voter registration extends the existing 15-day registration deadline in California to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote provisionally 14 days prior to an election and on Election Day. You can conditionally register in-person at a Vote Center or at the Registrar of Voters located at 1300 S. Grand Avenue, Building. C, Santa Ana, 92705. You may also conditionally register to vote online at www.ocvote.gov/registration but must then go to a Vote Center or the Registrar of Voters to be issued a provisional ballot.



Important Dates for the 2024 Presidential General Election

The Orange County Registrar of Voters created an Election Calendar to help you keep track of important deadlines for the 2024 Presidential General Election. You can access the calendar at www.ocvote.gov/calendar

- Thursday, September 26th: Voter Information Guides begin to be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7th: Vote-by-Mail Ballots begin to be delivered to U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7th: Early Voting Begins – Registrar of Voters Office and all Ballot Drop Boxes open for ballot drop-offs
- Monday, October 21st: Last Day to register to vote
- Saturday, October 26th: *SELECT* Vote Centers open across the county / Vote in-person
- Saturday, November 2nd: All Vote Centers Open / Vote in-person
- Tuesday, November 5th: Voting ends at 8:00 p.m.

The Financial Audit Oversight Committee Serves as an advisory body to the City Council, primarily overseeing internal audits. The responsibilities include issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP) for qualified audit firms, interviewing candidates, negotiating costs, and recommending a firm for selection. The committee also helps set goals for the annual audit plan and submits written and verbal audit reports to the City Council. The Streetscape and Transportation Advisory Commission advises the City Council on traffic safety, active transportation programs, and transportation management, including parking, speed humps, and vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian regulations per Title 13 of the Placentia Municipal Code. The Placentia Military Banner Recognition program is accepting applications for the 2024 installation. The program honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as active-duty or honorably discharged veterans in the United States Armed Forces. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia. The banner will be installed along Kraemer and Yorba Linda based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application. Applications are being accepted through October 21st, allowing time for the banners to be ordered and installed during November. The cost is \$260, and each service person is allowed one banner. Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event

The City of Placentia's next free Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event will occur on Saturday, October 26, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Placentia Civic Center, 401 East Chapman Avenue. Placentia residents and businesses are invited to dispose of unwanted electronics and shred confidential documents on-site for free.

A maximum of six (6) banker box size containers will be accepted from each household or business location in Placentia. Please place items in the trunk for easy access and ensure your containers are free from metals or debris that can damaged the shredding equipment. If the documents are in a 3-ring binder, please remove it before shredding. Paper clips, staples, rubber bands and file folders are acceptable. Most electronics that plug into an outlet and any items with a screen will be accepted for free, but there will be a fee for major household appliances. Automotive batteries and rechargeable tools and electronics batteries will also be accepted, but smaller household batteries will not.

No household hazardous waste such as chemicals, paint or unused medication will be accepted. To dispose of hazardous waste, please visit the nearest Orange County Hazardous Waste Collection Center. Placentia Pursues Prohousing Designation

The City of Placentia is excited to announce that our application to become a Prohousing Designated City will be formally submitted to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). In the coming months, HCD will review the application and issue a determination. The application requirements include insight into the following areas: formal resolutions or policy adoption, policy completion schedule, a proposed project scoring sheet, and examples of the City’s prohousing policies with enhancement factors. Once approved, Placentia would join other nearby designated cities like Brea, Rancho Cucamonga, and Santa Monica.

The purpose of the Prohousing Designation Program (PDP) is to increase the availability of housing statewide, promote the quality of life of all, and to end homelessness. With the designation, Placentia will receive additional support, grants, incentives, and accountability measures to help ensure that we are doing our part in making meaningful progress in the State’s affordable housing goals. Some of the grants the City would become eligible for include: Transformative Climate Communities (TCC), Solutions for Congested Corridors, Local Partnership Program, and the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP).
