Apply for City Committees

Get involved! The City is currently accepting applications for the following City Committees and Commissions: **Financial Audit Oversight Committee, Planning Commission, Streetscape and Transportation Commission.** The **Financial Audit Oversight Committee** serves as an advisory body to the City Council, primarily overseeing internal audits. The responsibilities include issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP) for qualified audit firms, interviewing candidates, negotiating costs, and recommending a firm for selection. The committee also helps set goals for the annual audit plan and submits written and verbal audit reports to the City Council. The **Planning Commission** recommends to the City Council the adoption, amendment, or repeal of the General Plan for the City's physical development. Oversees land subdivisions, advises on public works and redevelopment of blighted areas, and exercises zoning functions as prescribed by ordinance. The **Streetscape and Transportation Advisory Commission** advises the City Council on traffic safety, active transportation programs, and transportation management, including parking, speed humps, and vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian regulations per Title 13 of the Placentia Municipal Code. It also oversees public tree management, including removal and planting in public spaces, and reviews appeals of tree removal decisions. [Apply here.](#)



2024 Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drill

This year's Great ShakeOut Day is October 17th at 10:17 a.m., when millions of people worldwide will participate in earthquake drills at work, school, or home! The ShakeOut is our opportunity to practice how to protect ourselves during earthquakes. Your past experience in earthquakes may give you a false sense of safety; you didn't do anything, or you ran outside, yet you survived with no injuries. Or perhaps you got under your desk, and others thought you overreacted. However, you likely have never experienced the kind of strong earthquake shaking that is possible in much larger earthquakes: sudden and intense back-and-forth motions of several feet per second will cause the floor or the ground to jerk sideways out from under you and every unsecured object around you could fall or become airborne, potentially causing serious injury. This is why you must learn to immediately protect yourself after the first jolt. Don't wait to see if the earthquake shaking will be strong! In most situations, if you feel shaking or get an earthquake alert, immediately **DROP** where you are onto your hands and knees. This position protects you from being knocked down and reduces your chances of being hit by falling or flying objects. **COVER** your head and neck with one arm and hand. **HOLD ON** until the shaking stops.

Voter Registration Deadline is October 21st

The voter registration deadline for the 2024 Presidential General Election is October 21st. You can register to vote in Orange County online today at www.ocvote.gov/register. If you want to check your registration status, or if you need to make updates, you can do so online at www.ocvote.gov/verify. If you are unable to meet the voter registration deadline, you can still conditionally register to vote through November 5th. Conditional voter registration extends the existing 15-day registration deadline in California to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote provisionally 14 days prior to an election and on Election Day. You can conditionally register in-person at a Vote Center or at the Registrar of Voters located at 1300 S. Grand Avenue, Building. C, Santa Ana, 92705. You may also conditionally register to vote online at www.ocvote.gov/registration but must then go to a Vote Center or the Registrar of Voters to be issued a provisional ballot.



Important Dates for the 2024 Presidential General Election

The Orange County Registrar of Voters created an Election Calendar to help you keep track of important deadlines for the 2024 Presidential General Election. You can access the calendar at www.ocvote.gov/calendar

- Thursday, September 26th: Voter Information Guides begin to be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7th: Vote-by-Mail Ballots begin to be delivered to U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7th: Early Voting Begins – Registrar of Voters Office and all Ballot Drop Boxes open for ballot drop-offs
- Monday, October 21st: Last Day to register to vote
- Saturday, October 26th: *SELECT* Vote Centers open across the county / Vote in-person
- Saturday, November 2nd: All Vote Centers Open / Vote in-person
- Tuesday, November 5th: Voting ends at 8:00 p.m.

Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event

The City of Placentia's next free Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event will occur on Saturday, October 26, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Placentia Civic Center, 401 East Chapman Avenue. Placentia residents and businesses are invited to dispose of unwanted electronics and shred confidential documents on-site for free. A maximum of six (6) banker box size containers will be accepted from each household or business location in Placentia. Please place items in the trunk for easy access and ensure your containers are free from metals or debris that can damaged the shredding equipment. If the documents are in a 3-ring binder, please remove it before shredding. Paper clips, staples, rubber bands and file folders are acceptable. Most electronics that plug into an outlet and any items with a screen will be accepted for free, but there will be a fee for major household appliances. Automotive batteries and rechargeable tools and electronics batteries will also be accepted, but smaller household batteries will not. No household hazardous waste such as chemicals, paint or unused medication will be accepted. To dispose of hazardous waste, please visit the nearest Orange County Hazardous Waste Collection Center. Placentia Pursues Prohousing Designation

The City is excited to announce that our application to become a Prohousing Designated City will be formally submitted to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). In the coming months, HCD will review the application and issue a determination. The application requirements include insight into the following areas: formal resolutions or policy adoption, policy completion schedule, a proposed project scoring sheet, and examples of the City's prohousing policies with enhancement factors. Once approved, Placentia would join other nearby designated cities like Brea, Rancho Cucamonga, and Santa Monica. The purpose of the Prohousing Designation Program (PDP) is to increase the availability of housing statewide, promote the quality of life of all, and to end homelessness. With the designation, Placentia will receive additional support, grants, incentives, and accountability measures to help ensure that we are doing our part in making meaningful progress in the State's affordable housing goals. Some of the grants the City would become eligible for include: Transformative Climate Communities (TCC), Solutions for Congested Corridors, Local Partnership Program, and the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP). Additionally, to inform the community and discuss the City's Prohousing application, the Development Services Department will be hosting a community engagement meeting on October 10th at 5:00 p.m. The meeting will take place in the Front Community Room at City Hall, located at 401 E. 


