## Placentia Community Foundation Grants 2026

The Placentia Community Foundation Grant Program supports projects that preserve, protect, and enhance the quality of life for Placentia residents. Through this program, grants are awarded to nonprofit organizations, public schools, and libraries serving the Placentia community and addressing cultural, recreational, or educational needs.

Grant awards vary, with a maximum funding amount of \$5,000 per organization. Grants are not awarded to individuals or for political lobbying, campaign activities, or voter registration efforts.



## Development Services Department

### Specific Plan 5 - Community Meeting

The City of Placentia is advancing plans to revitalize the Specific Plan No. 5 (SP-5) corridor, a 19-acre area in southwest Placentia bordered by Orangethorpe Avenue, Placentia Avenue, Crowther Avenue, and SR-57. Historically home to hospitality, business parks, and auto-related uses, the corridor is being reimagined as a vibrant, mixed-use district that blends economic growth with community character. The SP-5 Corridor Plan envisions integrated residential, commercial, and hospitality development, enhanced walkability, public art, and green spaces. Community input is a key part of the process. The City will host a public meeting on **Thursday, March 5**, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. (presentation at 6:00 p.m.) at the Whitten Community Center, 900 S. Melrose Street. Attendees can learn about proposed land use concepts, design priorities, and economic strategies, and provide feedback to help shape the plan.



The project is expected to support long-term economic vitality by attracting new industries and investment while funding infrastructure improvements. This program offers peace of mind and a sense of security for those who enjoy their independence but need someone to check in on them from time to time. ## Public Works Department

### Temporary Full Closure of Golden Avenue Bridge

Construction on the Golden Avenue Bridge Replacement Project is now ongoing through Friday, September 11. This full bridge closure is necessary to safely complete significant infrastructure improvements to the bridge and the surrounding roadway.

**Location:** Golden Avenue Bridge

**Detour Routes:** Valencia Avenue, McCormack Lane, Bastanchury Road, and Rose Drive

**Schedule Note:** Construction schedules are subject to change due to weather or other operational factors.



This project will modernize the existing bridge and includes the addition of two 12-foot vehicular lanes, new sidewalks, bike lanes, a striped median center, hand railings, and comprehensive grading, drainage, utility, and roadway improvements, resulting in safer and more efficient travel for motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians.

Join us for a special Centennial Show & Tell at the Bradford House on the third Sunday in March! Bring a piece of Placentia history and share the story behind it.






